



Millars Well Primary School Good Standing Policy

Vision: Together

Purpose: Together everyone will experience friendship and achievement.

At Millars Well Primary School we believe learning is enhanced in a welcoming, inclusive, collaborative and culturally responsive environment. The Good Standing Policy supports this belief by acknowledging and rewarding exemplary behaviour, attendance and work ethic. It also emphasises the importance of taking responsibility for negative choices students may make which ultimately affects their own learning and safety and the learning and safety of others. This policy works in conjunction with our whole school Positive Behaviour Schools approach (PBS).

What is Good Standing?

All students commence the year with Good Standing. Maintaining Good Standing requires the students to fully adhere to the school's behaviour expectations outlined in our behaviour matrix. Students who maintain their Good Standing will be eligible to fully participate in:

- Incursions
- Excursions
- Sports carnivals
- Interschool carnivals
- Camps
- Extracurricular programs and activities
- End of year dinners and graduations
- And will have opportunity to represent our school at other activities and events

Loss of Good Standing

VIOLATION	DESCRIPTION	ACTION
Behaviour	More than five buddy class referrals in a term.	Loss of Good Standing for a period of 5 school days.
Behaviour	More than five office referrals to the office in a term.	Loss of Good Standing for a period of 8 school days.
Behaviour	More than three reported behaviour incidences (recorded on SIS) in a term.	Loss of Good Standing for a period of 10 school days.
Suspension	A suspension resulting from severe breach of School behaviour expectations and Department of Education policy.	Loss of Good Standing for a period of 25 school days.

A loss of Good Standing will result in students not being able to attend any extra-curricular activities including: incursions, excursions, sporting carnivals, camps, rewards, discos and any other type of school representation. Parents/Caregivers will be notified each time a student's behaviour has resulted in a loss of a Good Standing point.

The Good Standing Policy is provided to maintain consistency in our decision making processes. It is important to note that these are guidelines and if there are extenuating circumstances that have resulted in the negative behaviours or a student has special and/or additional needs these factors will be taken into account and any decision to withdraw or maintain Good Standing will be at the discretion of the Principal and Deputy Principals.
